> Chief Minister Launches 'Ungaludan Stalin' Initiative across Tamil Nadu



✓ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, on Tuesday (July 15, 2025), after launching the State-wide Ungaludan Stalin (Stalin with you) initiative and inaugurating the memorial hall and statue of former Tamil Nadu Congress Committee (TNCC) president L. Elayaperumal, a prominent leader who belonged to the Scheduled Caste, in Chidambaram, Mr. Stalin said the government has now removed the word 'colony' (indicating a habitation of SCs) from official records as it had come to symbolise oppression and carried the connotation of untouchability.

DEFENCE

- Exercise PASSEX
- ✓ Indian Navy and the Greek Navy held a PASSEX (Passing Exercise) near Mumbai in the Arabian Sea, led by INS Tarkash and HS Psara.



- ✓ This exercise is part of growing India-Greece defence ties, especially after both countries became strategic partners in 2023.
- ✓ INS Tarkash, inducted in 2012, is a Talwar-class stealth warship equipped with BrahMos missiles and is built to handle a wide range of missions.
- ✓ The PASSEX boosted teamwork and understanding between the two navies.

APPOINTMENT

- > T.N. Govt. Designates four IAS Officers as its Spokespersons
- ✓ For the first time, the Tamil Nadu government has designated four senior IAS officers as its spokespersons.



- ✓ The officers are J. Radhakrishnan, Gagandeep Singh Bedi, Dheeraj Kumar, and P. Amudha.
- ✓ The initiative is seen as part of the government's efforts to ensure that its functions, plans, welfare programmes, and information reach members of the public efficiently through the media.
